GOOD MORNING SUNSHINE



GOOD MORNING SUNSHINE is a reassurance program offered to seniors living alone. Someone from the City will call seniors periodically to check on them and to let them know someone cares about them. The program also assures City employees the seniors are OK. When seniors living alone don't show up as routinely expected to pay a utility bill, the employees become concerned. The employee or volunteer will maintain a record of the times called as well as general information about the participant. If the participant is not reached after three call attempts, the emergency contact will be notified. In the event the emergency contact cannot make contact with the participant, a member of the Goodlettsville Police Department will be dispatched to the residence.

A general information sheet and consent form can be picked up and turned in at Goodlettsville City Hall located at 105 South Main Street, Goodlettsville, Tennessee. If you have questions about the program, please contact a member of the City Hall staff at 615-851-2200
